Dear Mr. Ibanez:

I saw Arthur Shenvield in Chicago over the weekend, and he invited me to be a speaker at the Mont Pelerin Society conference in Chile this fall. He asked me to submit proposals for a possible talk, subject to the approval of you and the organizing committee.

I am currently working in the area of environmental carcinogens with the world-renowned biochemist, Dr. Bruce Ames of the University of California at Berkeley. This is a topic that is highly relevant to many areas of the "new regulation" as this now transpires in the United States, cancer-causing chemicals being one of the prime areas of attention of the FDA (e.g., saccharin), OSHA (workplace carcinogens), and the EPA (emissions in the air and water). In particular we are documenting the vast differences in the intrinsic carcinogenic strengths of different chemicals, which strengths can range over some ten million-fold. The failure to take these important differences into account leads to such ridiculous situations as the FDA devoting an enormous fraction of its resources to secure a ban against saccharin, a chemical so weak in its cancer-causing potency that its maximum effect could not be detected by any feasible epidemiology study, i.e., banning it would have zero detectable effect on observed cancer rates. I could readily put together a talk covering this topic, stressing the need for taking these vast differences into account for any sensible, cost-effective decision-making in this area (whether by a regulatory agency or a private firm), and for setting priorities. Given the enormous cost impact upon the operation of private businesses that "environmental" regulations currently have, this is a matter of some importance to students of the efficient market.

A second possible topic would be to document instances where regulatory decisions have been made on the basis of faulty science, along the lines of an editorial I wrote last fall for the newsletter of the American Council on Science and Health (enclosed). The importance of this lies in the fact that the regulatory burden we are currently saddled with has historically come about largely by means of "forcing incidents", where an accident concerning the public's health was so frightening as to "force", in a political sense, the establishment of a regulatory mechanism to prevent similar instances from occurring in the future. The thalidomide tragedy, leading to the tightening

of the FDA's rules governing the introduction of new drugs, is one such example. Well, by golly, it is time to start documenting examples of gross regulatory failure and incompetence on the part of the regulatory agencies, as a tool to roll back the regulatory burden. Lou Lasagna has done this brilliantly in the area of therapeutic drugs (and I suggest that he be invited as a speaker if a session on this topic is approved), and the instances I have collected represent the start of an effort to do this in the area of cancer-causing chemicals.

A third possible topic might be sociobiology. I mention this because this was the subject of Hayek's contribution to the Hong Kong conference, and because of the natural interest of MPS members in documented instances of the successful working of the "spontaneous order", which of course is what sociobiology is about. I have several publications in this area, so does Gordon Tullock (who should also be considered as a speaker on this topic). Too, if a session were arranged on this general matter, it would provide me with the means to invite several prominent scientists to the Mont Pelerin Society, a broadening of interest which I understand is a goal of the Society. I have in mind Ed Wilson of Harvard, who is the "father" of sociobiology, whom I know and whom I could probably get to come if he is invited as a speaker. Other speakers might include my good friend Dr. Bernard Davis of the Harvard Medical School, who is a brilliant man and elegant speaker and who distinguished himself on the side of the angels in a titanic battle over "affirmative action" at the Harvard Medical School a few years back. He is also an admirer and acquaintance of Milton Friedman. Another possible speaker would be Dr. Arthur Jensen of my university here at Berkeley, who is probably the most distinguished person in the world in the field of educational psychology and who, too, is an admirer of Friedrich Hayek and Milton Friedman. A session including Hayek, Tullock, Wilson, Davis and Jensen as key speakers would be an intellectual blockbuster.

I hope some of these ideas may be of interest to you.



MONT PELERIN SOCIETY

The Aims of the Society.

(These Aims were those agreed by the Founder Members, 10 April 1947.)

The central values of civilisation are in danger. Over large stretches of the earth's surface the essential conditions of human dignity and freedom have already disappeared. In others they are under constant menace from the development of current tendencies of policy. The position of the individual and the voluntary group are progressively undermined by extensions of arbitrary power. Even that most precious possession of Western Man, freedom of thought and expression, is threatened by the spread of creeds which, claiming the privilege of tolerance when in the position of a minority, seek only to establish a position of power in which they can suppress and obliterate all views but their own.

The group holds that these developments have been fostered by the growth of a view of history which denies all absolute moral standards and by the growth of theories which question the desirability of the rule of law. It holds further that they have been fostered by a decline of belief in private property and the competitive market; for without the diffused power and initiative associated with these institutions it is difficult to imagine a society in which freedom may be effectively preserved.

Believing that what is essentially an ideological movement must be met by intellectual argument and the reassertion of valid ideals, the group, having made a preliminary exploration of the ground, is of the opinion that further study is desirable inter alia in regard to the following matters:

- (1) The analysis and exploration of the nature of the present crisis so as to bring home to others its essential moral and economic origins.
- (2) The redefinition of the functions of the state so as to distinguish more clearly between the totalitarian and the liberal order.
- (3) Methods of re-establishing the rule of law and of assuring its development in such manner that individuals and groups are not in a position to encroach upon the freedom of others and private rights are not allowed to become a basis of predatory power.

- (4) The possibility of establishing minimum standards by means not inimical to initiative and functioning of the market.
- (5) Methods of combatting the misuse of history for the furtherance of creeds hostile to liberty.
- (6) The problem of the creation of an international order conducive to the safeguarding of peace and liberty and permitting the establishment of harmonious international economic relations.

The group described itself as the Mont Pelerin Society. It emphasised that it did not intend to create an orthodoxy, to form or to align itself with any political party or parties, or to conduct propaganda. Its sole object was to facilitate an exchange of ideas between like-minded scholars in the hope of strengthening the principles and practice of a free society and to study the workings, virtues, and defects of market-oriented economic systems.

Dear Dr. Irving,

I am glad to inform you that the Mont Pelerin Society will hold a Regional Meeting in Viña del Mar, Chile, from 15 to 19 November 1981. And it is my pleasant task to invite you to attend this Meeting, and to say that it will be of particular interest to the members of the Society if you could prepare a paper on the subject "Freedom of Expression and Misinformation in the Western World".

We consider this to be one of the most important and serious topics at the present time. The evolution of the press - and for that matter of the media as a whole- towards the formation of large corporations requiring immense resources and complex technology seems to be limiting and even eliminating the smaller or weaker organs of communication. Thus in some cities there is a noticeable trend towards a growing monopoly of information, and fair advantage is not always taken of this situation of power. Furthermore, the big advertisers demand a large circulation for their advertisements, although they may later complain about the misleading information or the poor quality of the media they finance.

These comments only approximately suggest our concern underlying the inclusion of this item in the agenda, but they involve no suggestion of any kind. What are of particular interest to the Committee are your views, and therefore we would like to request you to elucidate this issue in the light of your special knowledge of the subject permanently expressed in your concern about "Accuracy in media".

We await with great interest your favourable response to this request. Needless to say, the cost of your fare and stay in Viña del Mar will be covered by the organizing Committee.

Dear Señor Ibañez,

I have your first notice of the meeting in Chile of the Mont Pelerin Society this coming November 15-19 and am looking forward to attending. You and I have had several discussions with one another at MPS meetings in recent years, including this past September in Stanford. Enclosed is an article of mine, first published about two years ago, which may help you remember me and my monetary philosophy.

I would like to have an opportunity to speak at the November Regional meeting. I have spoken at Guatemala, Amsterdam and Madrid regional meetings on the program and at almost every one since 1965 at some time from the floor.

As I think that you know - but I am not positive that you do - my father was the Dr. Edwin Walter Kemmerer who headed a financial advisory mission to Chile in the summer of 1925. I was only a college student (at Princeton) at the time but had the opportunity to go along as an assistant secretary. It was not a lofty assignment but certainly all I deserved at the time, and I was privileged to sit in on just about all committee meetings of the mission members, listen to their discussions, and be with them constantly. It was a liberal education. I even kept a full diary. I was 19 that summer and also had the opportunity to see a good deal of Chile, although I have always thought that I missed the most scenic parts, for I never got farther south than Concepcion and have always wanted to repair that oversight. I plan to do so this coming November. It will be my first return to Chile since 1925 - 56 years ago - and I'm sure that I'll notice many changes.

One of my major interests after becoming a professor of economics - economic and financial history, especially - at Illinois was the study of monetary systems both in the United States and elsewhere. This was perhaps natural, with my family background. When I attended the regional meeting in Guatemala in 1973, I told the Mont Pelerin group about Guatemala's monetary reform in 1924. I was there the summer before we were in Chile. I should like to have the opportunity to discuss some aspects of Chile's monetary history since the 1920s and hope that your committee may find that topic an appropriate one for your program.

Would you please either pass this letter on to the appropriate committee or else write me and tell me with whom I should get in touch. These matters are usually settled far ahead of time.

When we were in Chile in 1925 the Minister of War was named Ibañez - not an unusual Spanish name, I know - and the President was named Alessandri. As I recall the same two families were prominent again in Chilean politics just a short time ago. Incidentally, are you related to the Ibañez of the 1925 era who was Minister of War?

WHY A GOLD STANDARD?



By DR. DONALD L. KEMMERER

Dr. Kemmerer has all his degrees from Princeton University. As a young man, he served on financial advisory missions to Chile, Poland and Nationalist China. For 36 years, until his recent retirement, he taught economics and American economic and financial history at the University of Illinois. He has also been president of the Committee for Monetary Research and Education since its founding in 1970.



It is time that the nations of our price-inflation scoured world reconsider the idea of returning to the gold coin standard that served many of them so well during the late 19th and early 20th centuries.

"PAPER IS UNLIMITED"

True, it is not a perfect institution, but no economic system devised and directed by fallible man ever is perfect. In retrospect, the gold coin standard looks better than the paper money systems under which most modern nations have operated since the early 1930s. At that time, they hastily abandoned gold even though both economists and government officials had for decades looked upon the gold standard as one of mankind's most successful financial achievements. The plain facts are that paper is *unlimited*... gold is not, and *that* is the basic advantage of the gold standard!

But since the 1930s, the world has continuously heard the alleged advantages of putting more buying power in the hands of people, of "pump priming" to avoid depression or come out of recession, and of making larger credits available to "lower" interest rates and to promote economic growth.

These proposals are all price-inflationary . . . and mostly have their origin in the economics of the late John Maynard Keynes. The government policies to which they gave rise have been largely responsible for the chronic price inflation that has beset the world the past 45 years — the most rapid price rises ever known in civilized nations during peacetime.

Yet mention of the gold standard frightens the average man and even the average economist. They believe a return to gold would cause prices to fall. They feel that "Rising prices and prosperity go together . . . falling prices and depression are companions." This is not true!

PRICES FELL STEEPLY

For example, when prices were steeply rising, as in Germany and Austria after World War I, those economies were in a depression. And when the price level was steeply falling — as in the United States and Great Britain in 1920-21 and 1929-32 — those economies were also in a depression.

But when prices were gradually declining — as in the United States from the end of the Civil War until 1896 — or else gradually rising — as in the U. S. from 1896 to 1914 — the economy was in a state of prosperity most of the time. The steepness of the rise or fall of the price level is more important than its direction!

The remedy lies in ending the price inflation. When a people and their government want to do that, they can do it without great pain . . . the desire is what counts most. And . . . in order to restore confidence in their paper money, nations in the past have had to

make that money convertible on demand into a precious metal. Usually it has been gold.

AT A NOMINAL CHARGE

In the early 1900s, when the U.S.A. was on the gold coin standard, our government said in essence, "We declare a dollar is 23.22 grains of gold . . . out of a troy ounce (480 grains) we can mint \$20.67. If you have gold in any form, bring it to the Mint and at a nominal charge we will make it into gold coin that you can spend." There was a free market for gold between the people and their governments across most of the free world.

Normally, people did not demand gold for their dollars . . . but if they did exert that discipline, it was a sign — like a blown fuse in your home from an electric overload — that the Federal Reserve System should impose restraints on credit, or that Congress should restrain its spending propensities.

Of several classes of gold standard, the system that worked best is the one that many countries had prior to 1914 and that the United States had until 1933. This is the gold coin standard, with coins of relatively small denomination circulating freely in the hands of the citizens.

DIFFICULT TO RECALL

The gold coin system has this little-realized advantage: once the coins are circulating widely, it is difficult, embarrassing and costly to call them back. This obliges the government in office to reflect carefully before letting itself get into a situation where a planned devaluation would necessitate recalling the gold coins. That potential embarrassment is a safeguard for the people in much the same way as biennial elections of Congressmen are a safeguard, causing our Representatives to heed the wishes of the voters.

President Franklin D. Roosevelt was able to call in the gold coins in 1933 because the public did not know what his administration had in mind. But it will be a long time before

another U. S. administration can engineer a coup like that!

It is my recommendation that America continue along the "road back to gold" on which it started in 1974, with these three steps already taken: (1) Congress has made it legal for American citizens to own gold; (2) Congress has repealed the Joint Resolution of June 5, 1933, abrogating the use of gold clauses in contracts; and (3) in October, 1978, Congress passed a gold medallion bill to provide Americans with purchasable gold coins.

CONVERTIBLE ON DEMAND

The final, relatively short step would be for our nation to return to the gold coin standard . . . for example, the U. S. Mint would produce gold coins in denominations of say \$50, \$100 and \$200, which would be full legal tender and into which all other monies would be convertible on demand.

If the people and the government really desire to take this step, it could be effected fairly soon. That there is a demand for gold coin in this country is seen from the Department of Commerce figures that about \$250 million in gold coins were imported into the U. S. in 1977.

I have personally witnessed gold standard resumption in three nations, and I have studied the history of such resumptions in two dozen nations between 1800 and 1929. Very few resumptions have failed, and when one has, it has generally been because a war or revolution intervened. Converting paper dollars, marks, francs or lira into a trusted precious metal is the chief way that man has ended inflations in the past. Restoring confidence in a currency is after all the only way to stop an inflation!

There are of course numerous arguments against the gold coin standard . . . but let's look briefly at the main ones to see how valid they are:

- (1) "**There is not enough gold to return to the gold standard.**" When gold was artifi-

cially held down to \$35 an ounce, there was some truth to that argument. But now, with the market price ranging near and sometimes above \$250 an ounce, it's as though we had seven times as much gold! The free world's monetary gold is now worth about \$285 billion . . . and evidence is strong that much, much more exists in hoards around the world. If we and other nations return to a gold coin standard, hoarders will bring gold to the Mint to be coined into money to invest. They will want interest on their savings as soon as they realize the inflationary danger is past and they can again trust the currency.

(2) **"The price of gold is too volatile."** Before accepting that fallacy, remember that the recent fluctuations in price involve gold as a commodity rather than as a monetary base. The fluctuations are in paper dollars. Much of this volatility is due to the waxing and waning distrust of the paper dollar and to depreciation of the paper dollar itself.

(3) **"Returning to the gold standard would cause a depression."** This argument reminds me of the ivory-tower physicist who theorized that "No insect built like a bumble bee could possibly fly." In the real world, when the U. S. returned to a gold standard in 1879, prosperity came immediately . . . and the same thing happened when Germany stabilized its currency in 1924.

(4) **"Goods shortages and labor monopolies are causing this inflation . . . returning to gold won't help."** It is true that these shortages do contribute to a rising price level. But research shows that the U. S. money supply grew at an annual rate of under 2% in the mid-1950s to over 7% by the mid-1970s, while real annual rates of economic growth averaged about 3.3%. In brief, the American money supply increased twice as fast as the nation's goods supply . . . and that has been the primary cause of rising prices. A gold standard tends to restrain the growth of the money supply!

(5) "**Most economists today oppose the gold standard, and they should know.**" In the 1900-30 period, the great majority of economists favored the gold standard. For the past 40 years, most economists, under the influence of Keynes, have disapproved of it. Apparently, one of these two generations of economists is wrong! The price inflation has worsened greatly as a result of following the advice of the anti-gold economists, some of whom now admit they don't know how to stop inflation. It therefore appears that the Keynesian economists are wrong!

(6) "**Offering to buy unlimited amounts of gold at a high fixed price would help Russia and South Africa.**" That is true. But if we need the gold and are willing to pay the price, it is a situation in which "Nobody loses in a fair exchange." We buy chrome from Communist Russia — rather than from capitalist Rhodesia — and Communist Russia buys our capitalist American wheat!

(7) "**People will never again submit to the discipline of the gold standard.**" But what is their alternative . . . a continuation of ever-depreciating paper money? Obviously at present, the government — incited by a population that demands prompt delivery of more than the nation can afford to provide — cannot discipline itself while using an inconvertible paper money standard. Imposing a debt ceiling is next to useless. The gold standard, by limiting the monetary base, helps government to restrain its spending and to discipline itself. That's why price levels were more stable in the 19th century than in the 18th or 20th centuries.

(8) "**Returning to gold would stifle economic growth.**" The historical record shows just the opposite. The period from 1879 to 1914 in this country, when America was on a gold standard, was an era of tremendous economic growth. The economic history of England, France and Germany, also on the


gold coin standard in those years, reveals similar satisfactory economic growth.

(9) "The gold standard will break down sooner or later, especially in a war." Yes, a tornado will demolish a house . . . should we therefore live in a cave? An auto will smash up in a head-on collision . . . should we therefore walk instead of ride? In wartime we do have to give up some of our freedoms . . . should we give them up in peacetime as well?

(10) "Gold would not give us stable prices . . . it did not in the past." Perhaps not, but it did much better than inconvertible paper money systems have done. When perfection is not attainable, at least we can and should try for the improvement that a gold standard provides.

(11) "Why not a platinum, or a brick, standard instead of gold?" Down through the ages, nations have tried hundreds of commodities as standards. Gold, because of many qualities that the others had to a lesser degree, or not at all, proved to be the most effective and thus the most popular. It would take a colossal re-education job to persuade the world that platinum or bricks would make a better standard than gold. It would cost tens of billions of dollars. And in the end, would such a standard really be any better? I don't think so. Why not make the most of what we have — gold, which has enjoyed respect as a money unit throughout history?

(12) "Americans don't need gold to back the dollar; it's backed by the industrial might of the American economy." This is meaningless double-talk. Can anyone distrusting the dollar redeem it in a unit of "industrial might"? There is no machinery for this kind of redemption of paper dollars, and thus no restraint upon a spend-happy government . . . and no protection for the people. A sound money can do much to bolster an ailing economy . . . and a weak money can seriously undermine a strong economy . . . as recent American history demonstrates!

THEFT OF SAVINGS

In conclusion, let me say this: In the past when the public grew tired of price inflation and the theft of their savings it caused, public pressure brought about a return to a precious metal standard. The United States returned to gold in 1789-92, 1817, 1879 and 1919. Major nations of Western Europe did it also. When the public becomes disillusioned with inconvertible paper money, the situation generally requires gold convertibility to restore public confidence!

thank you ever so much for your good letter and your kind invitation which I will accept although it means a considerable sacrifice to me. If only the meeting would take place in the following week, which in the United States is the socially amusing but "commercially" sterile Thanksgiving Week. You see, I will arrive in the United States about October 1st in order to lecture until about December 10th. That week starting November 15th just takes me out of circulation !!!

I have written to Don Arturo Fontaine of El Mercurio asking him about that regional meeting of the MPS of which I am no longer a member. I left with Roepke, Rüstow, Briefs etc. in 1961 after the Turin-Meeting, but I am quite ready to speak in Viña del Mar. (Max Thurn is a second degree cousin of my wife who always asks me to return to the fold !)


You expect me probably to speak in English. I know Mr Shenfield, I know Mr Kristol even better. I consider him the finest mind in the American Conservative scene - in addition a man who (rightly) insists that the Right should develop an ideology of its own since one cannot fight a hostile (leftist) ideology with a non-ideology.

I have been 6 times to Chile, 5 times before Allende and the 6th time after that catastrophic period. (My brother-in-law was for several years Austrian Ambassador.) I have great friends in Santiago - the Larrains, the Filippis, some members of the OPUS DEI. My book Las lagrimas de Dios was published by Ercilla in 1957.

Do you use the term "capitalism" ? I prefer "free enterprise" for psychological reasons.

I wonder whether you would like to arrange other lectures for me during that period or immediately after (as during Thanksgiving I am free). I gave in the past quite a number of lectures in Spanish (with a rather Castilian accent) in Spain - in El Ateneo, the Instituto de Ciencias Políticas, the Universidad de Navarra. I would, however, have to send a text for translation - which I read with one eye ^{closed} at the public and the other eye looking at the notes. I cannot speak freely in Spanish, but I am all right in the discussion : I have the courage to speak ungrammatically - as long as my speech can be understood. (My French is ~~my~~ as good as my English.) - I am enclosing a self-advertising leaflet which I always use for my lectures in the USA. (By the way: between May 21 and June 17th I will be in Japan !)

Kindly fill out the form at the bottom of the page and mail it in. No obligation whatever is involved. Just the reverse - I would feel flattered if you would like a copy.

A word about the Mont Pelerin Society. This is a group of scholars, business leaders, and interested individuals like myself, who are dedicated to the cause of individual freedom in one or more of its many aspects. This group is composed of individuals from almost all the nations of the Western World, who periodically meet in various parts of the world to read papers, discuss current world developments and otherwise exchange ideas. I regard them as among the advanced thinkers* of our age, because they are anchored to what I regard as sound economic principles, a philosophy of a high order, and a never ending desire to search and learn. In regard to the recent conservative victory in England, Mrs. Thatcher gives a large part of the credit to the English members of the Mont Pelerin Society, whose educational efforts (through the Institute of Economic Affairs) of the past twenty years have begun to bear fruit. The thesis is that ideas, once accepted, become the basis of all important movements in history - good or bad. In fact, this is our hope today.

The U. S. economy, security markets and the money and credit systems - in the past decade or more - have been drastically affected by governmental intervention both here and abroad. Keeping in touch with such a group of whom I term advanced thinkers,* one can't help but derive much benefit and clarification of thinking. Although no one knows what the future holds, these meetings do help to provide both current and basic information.

My Notes were made at the Madrid meeting September 2nd through September 7th. They cover summaries of many subjects and issues regarding politics and economics, money and inflation, education and the state, the problem of union labor, the struggle of socialism and liberty, the outlook for the economies in various countries, etc. Obvious qualifications include: accuracy of interpretation, proper emphasis, possible omissions, etc. If questions arise, feel free to inquire or correct.

This particular meeting was indeed one of the liveliest because of the number of turn-of-events that have recently occurred. To some, they did provide hope for the so-called "free market" cause, which in turn is so intimately tied up with the future of property rights and the investment markets of the world.

*How could anything be more prophetic of the past three or more decades than "The Road to Serfdom" by F. A. von Hayek, the titular head of the Mont Pelerin Society?





I am pleased to be able to inform you of a meeting of our Society to be held in Christchurch New Zealand in late November this year. This letter is a preliminary notice and more detailed information will be sent to you by May.

As you will no doubt be aware, the Labour Party government in New Zealand has been instituting over the past few years some of the most radical reforms in economic policy anywhere in the world. To a lesser extent this is also true of Australia. New Zealand has embarked on a program of deregulation, privatisation, and microeconomic reform unheard of in such a short period of time — and all undertaken by a nominally socialist government. There are lessons in this for all MPS members.

The theme for the conference will be 'Achieving Reform' and one major session will concentrate on the reforms instituted by New Zealand, how it was done and what remains to be done. A keynote speaker will be the architect of New Zealand's free market reforms, former Finance Minister Roger Douglas.

Other sessions at the meeting will be devoted to the political philosophy of Karl Popper (who taught at the University of Canterbury in Christchurch for 8 years in 1937-46); aid and trade, and the problems of small nations (concentrating on the Pacific); property rights, the environment and 'green' politics; race, indigenous peoples and the policy agenda; the responsibilities of the press, and more. Further program details will be sent later.


To tackle with the responsibilities of carrying out the meeting in Viña del Mar, we have the help of prominent scholars and businessmen of the country.

Dear Mr. President:

In the absence of Mr. Pedro Ibáñez, President of the Executive Committee for the forthcoming Regional Meeting of the Mont Pelerin Society, who is at present in Europe, I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 9th, the terms of which I have communicated to Mr. Ibáñez by telephone. Pending his return to Chile he has asked me to put forward the following comments.

We feel it necessary to remind the meeting of the Regional Committee held in Santiago on 24th April last, and attended by Professor von Hayek and yourself. The purpose of that meeting was to review the contents of the programme for the Regional Meeting and discuss related financial aspects.

As regards the composition of the programme a number of decisions were adopted concerning the topics to be dealt with and the speakers and panalists who it was thought should take part in the debates. On that occasion you asked that your name be removed as a speaker on the subject "Introduction of Market Economies: An Historical View" in which you had originally intended to comment on the Japanese experience. You suggested that

Professor Motoo Kaji should take your place as a speaker on this occasion. At the same time you proposed that the subject "Should State Enterprises Exist?" be entrusted to Professor Yukihide Okano. Letters of invitation -to which we have as yet had no reply - were immediately dispatched to these gentlemen at the addresses which you provided for the purpose, and copies were forwarded to you under cover of our letter of May 26th.

Finally, in connexion with the programme, since Professor von Hayek would be unable to come to the Regional Meeting, you offered to send a message of greetings on video tape to be recorded by him during his visit to Japan in October next.

With regard to financing aspects, decisions were taken at the same meeting concerning the registration fees to be charged to members and guests. On the subject of covering the costs of the meeting, you announced the decision to provide an initial contribution of US\$ 20.000.- subject to a possible increase to US\$ 40.000.- depending upon the general financial situation of the Society. The remaining financial requirements were left to the exclusive attention of the local Committee.

On 28 May and 7 July we sent you letters listing the names of Japanese firms operating in Chile, as requested by you, in order to approach them for financial support. In the second of these letters reference was made to the invitations forwarded to Professors Yukihide Okano and Motoo Kaji, to which, as already mentioned, this Regional Committee is still awaiting a reply.

A second Announcement regarding the Regional Meeting was sent to members and guests in the first week of July, together with the programme and the necessary registration forms. Similary, all the members of the Regional Committee - consisting as you will no doubt recollect, of Messrs. Paulo Ayres of Brazil, Alberto Benegas Jr. of Argentina, and Ramón Díaz of Uruguay - and the Chilean members of the Society, were informed of the decisions taken during your visit to this country in April.

In the light of the foregoing circumstances we are frankly perplexed by what you say in your letter of 9 July to the effect that you neither find any role nor function to play as the President of Mont Pelerin Society in the programme for the Regional Meeting in Viña del Mar. The request made to you that you deliver the inaugural speech, and present a paper on the reality of conditions in Japan, your participation in the meeting of 24 April, and subsequent preparatory work carried out in accordance with your instructions and decisions, represent clear evidence of the interest of this Regional


Committee, not only that you attend the meeting, but also take a decidedly direct part at the inaugural ceremony and throughout the discussions. As agreed at the April 24 meeting, these aspects were left to your exclusive decision. We are consequently at a loss to understand what reasons may have induced you to take such a disconcerting, untoward and abrupt decision as that announced in your letter.

We are taking the liberty of sending a copy of the present letter to the members of the Board of Directors of the Society since they have been made aware of the contents of yours. In so doing we are also of the belief that the misinterpretation evidenced by your remarks should be set right with the Society's directors in order that they be reassured regarding the arrangements so far made in preparation for the Viña del Mar meeting.

Finally, I think you should know how greatly the members of this Regional Committee regret the situation referred to, arising from circumstances for which we can find no apparent explanation.

Dear Prof. Nishiyama,

Due to an absence abroad of more than two months I have been unable to communicate with you in the usual way; although before leaving Chile work was already in hand on the various suggestions you made while here for the better organization of the Viña del Mar meeting.

The decisions reached with you during your visit to Santiago have been fully implemented, as confirmed in the letter sent you by Prof. Carlos Cáceres at my specific request on 22 July.

INVITATIONS. During the few weeks between your visit to Chile and my own departure abroad, arrangements were made with both the Regional and Local Committees to fulfil all the measures agreed with you.

Some fifty invitations to prominent personalities in Argentina and a similar number in Brazil were accordingly dispatched with the assistance of our friends Paulo Ayres and Alberto Benegas Lynch.

2.

FINANCING OF THE CONFERENCE. After your visit to Chile an agreement was reached with the Local Committee regarding a scheme to raise funds to meet the Conference Budget. Discounting the fees to be paid by those attending the Conference and the sum of US\$ 20.000.- offered by you, the remaining sum to be financed, as you were informed in detail, amounted to US\$ 150.000.-

A number of companies in Chile have undertaken to contribute approximately 60 per cent of this balance. It will probably prove more difficult to raise the remaining 40 per cent, but we still have three months in hand and moreover are confident that you will be receiving additional contributions from Japanese corporations operating in Chile, thus enabling you to raise your contribution eventually to US\$ 40.000.-

We are at present actively engaged on the organization of the Meeting and completing the financing arrangements. For the latter purpose I have asked our friend Max Thurn to provide a letter authorizing us to undertake certain administrative and financial formalities in connexion with the Mont Pelerin meeting in Viña del Mar. The basic intention is to permit contributions from Chilean corporations to be treated as pre-tax expenses.

SPEAKERS. As regards the agenda and speakers I am taking the liberty of enclosing a separate sheet with detailed information. You will note that we are on the point of completing a list of two speakers for each subject. We should be most grateful if you were able to obtain a favourable decision from Professor Yukihide Okano who has not yet answered our invitation.

DISCUSSANTS. Within the next few days we will be meeting to consider the names of the discussants. Due to the high cost of travel to Chile we shall as far as possible complete the list by selecting persons who have already confirmed their attendance at the Viña del Mar Conference, and shall give you further information in this respect in due course.

A matter that remains to be settled is that of the presidential address which was left pending by you after protracted discussion between yourself and Professor Hayek at the meeting in Santiago on 24 April.

We earnestly trust that the information provided in Professor Cáceres' letter of 22 July and in the present letter will enable you to reconsider the assumption implied in your letter of 9 July under which you felt inclined to abstain from participating in the Viña del Mar Meeting.

I acknowledge the probability that the considerable volume of work involved in organizing this Conference and my somewhat protracted absence from Chile may have delayed the submission of prompt information to you regarding the way in which the agreements adopted have been carried into execution. I nevertheless trust that you will gather from this letter and that of Professor Cáceres that those agreements have been implemented in full.

If you were not informed of these particulars earlier, I must ask you to attribute the delay to my prolonged absence from the country and accept my apologies for this circumstance.

Comments and letters have been arriving from distinguished members of the Society which reveal real interest in the Viña del Mar Meeting and presage its success. I therefore feel confident that you will wish to reconsider the intention expressed in your letter of 9 July in order that we may count on your attendance and thereby ensure that the meeting be as successful as we wish it to be.



Dear Dr. Pedro Ibanez:

Thank you very much for your letter of December 10th, 1980 and a copy of tentative programme for the Chile Meeting of the Mont Pelerin Society. For some reason or another, I received all these only on January 20th, 1981, although they were air mailed by your office.

I trust that you are aware of the necessity of obtaining the approval of the programme from the executive committee. I am just about leaving for Berlin in order to finalize our preparation for the 1982 General Meeting of the Society. I will have the opportunity of discussing your proposed programme with the other members of the executive committee and also obtaining reactions from other senior members of the Society in Europe as well as in the United States on the way home. I am coming back to Japan by February 7th. I shall write you again then and let you know our reaction to your tentative programme.

On the whole the tentative programme appears to me fine. And the most important point is, of course, to adjust the discussions at the Meeting to the situations in your country as well as in other countries in South America. But as the President of the Society I must request you to invite all the members of the Board and cover their travel and hotel expenses as much as possible. I shall see to it that the amount, which your regional committee can not raise for this purpose, will be financed by some other way. Therefore, please let me know how much will be necessary for this as soon as it becomes clear.

I notice that my name appears at the very end of the programme as a discussant; though having the honour of being with Bill Simon.

Does this mean that you think I am incapable of delivering not only the Presidential Lecture but also even a paper, which may contribute to the cause of Freedom in South America? Let me propose here again to you, as I did in my previous letter, that your committee let me deliver the presidential address at the Chilean Regional Meeting under the title of

either "The Order of Freedom and Japan,"

or "The Rise of Grassroot Liberalism."

I proposed the first title to you in my letter of December 19th, 1980. But I have heard nothing from you thus far. Perhaps it takes unusual time to correspond between your country and my country.

I am coming to your country and going to spend the week of April 20, 1981. I can have then the opportunity of personally going over the programme and other related matters with you gentlemen, i.e. the members of the Regional Preparation Committee.



Thank you very much for your letter of July 7.

I am greatly in favour of your proposal. However, Chile is as far as, and as close as, Hong Kong to many people. The Hong Kong Meeting is not going to have the attendance of as many the members of the Society as we usually have for the general meeting. I wonder if the Society can afford for having the two general meetings in a row under the similar conditions.

But I would strongly support the proposal, if it were for a regional meeting in Chile in 1979 or 1981. Japan has had so far only only a regional meeting. In fact, even the United States has had the same in the last several years. Regional meeting does not imply the meeting only for the regional people. On the contrary, all the regional meetings have had the attendance of all the key members of the Society, perhaps even better than some of general meetings.

Dear Ed:

Thank you very much for your letter of May 20, which I came to read only today, July 8, because of the mix-up that was caused by the moves not only of my house but also of my office. I must apologize for the delay of my reaction to your letter.

I completely agree with your comment on the letter from Dr. Ibanez. It is a surprise to me that the letter was sent only to you and the copies to Max Thurn and Jim Buchanan. I have received none of such a letter nor any aide-memoire on the Meering held in Santiago from Dr. Ibanez.

It is true that I verbally suggested that I might provide the Chilean group with US\$ 20,000 at maximum, with the provisos that I would succeed in raising the amount in Japan, and that the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors would approve the contribution of MPS to a regional meeting. After I have had the conversations with the leading members of the Committee and the Board, I have come to learn that the general consensus finds such an action, if ever be made, would set up a bad precedence for the future and moreover completely violate the resolution made by the Board of Directors Meeting in Stanford in as recent as the last fall.

Besides, so far I have not been able to raise US\$ 20,000 for the purpose yet, although I might well succeed in doing so by the coming October or so. In any case I find it rather absurd that the budgetting for a regional meeting should be in short of US\$ 150,000 in the face of the fact that the General Meeting held in Stanford had cost only US\$ 50,000 more than US\$ 150,000 and so will the General Berlin Meeting in 1982.

Therefore in the capacity of the President of MPS I will be willing to contribute US\$ 20,000 at maximum, if I would succeed in raising that much for the Chilean meeting in Japan, and if the local preparation committee for the Chilean regional meeting would be willing either to cut down the total cost to less than US\$ 100,000 or to the level reasonable to a regional meeting, and if the Executive Committee and the Board Directors would approve such a contribution of MPS to the Chilean meeting. By so saying, I certainly do not imply that the Chilean group must not be allowed to hold a large meeting, in so far as the group can finance it by itself, and in so far as the number of the guests will not become larger than the number of the members who would attend. The second condition was strongly insisted by the Chairman of the Membership Committee, Prof. Harold Demsetz.
